Location/Facility	 Sections have local control to schedule host sites. A one- or two-day Nordic ski meet is recommended for the Sections.
Tournament Format	 Sections must be scheduled in two sessions or more (morning and afternoon) to minimize the number of teams at the facility at one time. Sections will determine which teams compete in each session. A maximum of 4 teams or 28 student athletes may be at the start area at a time. The student athletes must remain socially distanced and masked in the start area. An interval start race is required. Teams not competing on the course must remain in their Team Camps separated from other teams and spectators.
Changes/ Adjustments in MSHSL Approved Season Sport Guidance	 All MSHSL Approved Season Sport Guidance and Information remain in effect. The number of teams at the start area at one time is increased to 4. Additional teams will start in waves 5-10 minutes apart. Maximum number of skiers in a wave is 28. Additional Section Teams must remain in their Team Camps when not competing.

Information on Advancement	 2 teams from each section will qualify for the state meet. Team size: 7 skiers + 2 alternates 6 individuals not on a qualifying team will advance to state.
